MARCH IN O.C. HISTORY



On March 10, 1933, a severe (approx. 6.4 on Richter scale) earthquake hit Orange County at 5:54 p.m. It was centered three and a half miles southwest of Newport Beach. Four Orange County residents were killed and many buildings were damaged or destroyed. (Including the Old County Courthouse above)

March 02, 1934	Police radio was used for the first time in Orange County. The first broadcast, which was sent from the County jail, stated that the outlaw Charles "Pretty Boy" Floyd had been seen west of Anaheim.
March 05, 1991	Lake Forest voted to incorporate as a city. The measure passed 5,590 to 2,614.
Mach 08, 1992	Christian Nelson, resident of Laguna Hills and inventor of the Eskimo Pie ice cream bar, died at age 99.
March 11, 1889	California Governor Robert Waterman signed the bill allowing the election that ultimately created the new County of Orange
March 18, 1967	Pirates of the Caribbean opened to the public at Disneyland. Its official grand opening fol- lowed on April 19th.
March 21, 2006	"The Real Housewives of the OC," a "reality" series set in Coto de Caza, debuted on the Bra- vo cable network.
March 27, 1955	Rev. Robert Schuller of Crystal Cathedral fame preached his first sermon in Orange County from the roof of the snack bar at the Orange Drive-In Theater.
