

MEET NEW OC CLERK-RECORDER HUGH NGUYEN

The Orange County Board unanimously voted on April 2 to appoint Hugh



Nguyen as Orange County's new Clerk-Recorder. Nguyen has worked for the county since 1993. He was hired by former Clerk-Recorder Gary Granville and most recently served as the Assistant Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. Nguyen's appointment followed interviews with 11 candidates for Clerk-Recorder, which is one of seven countywide elected offices. Board Chairman Shawn Nelson praised Nguyen's extensive background in county management., including eight years as Chief Deputy Recorder. "We are very proud of and thrilled for Hugh Nguyen," Nelson said. "This is the culmination of 18 years of hard work and it's now our job to commit every resource we can to guarantee his success." Nguyen said his priority for the office

is to provide consistent high-quality public service and safeguard public records with an emphasis on integrity, accountability, performance and dedication. "This is the only job I want for the rest of my career," he told members of the Board of Supervisors during his job interview. "I will make a long-term commitment to this position." Nguyen migrated to the United States as a child from Vietnam and was raised by his grandparents and aunts. Following graduation from Saddleback High School, he married his high school sweetheart. The couple lives in Santa Ana with their two children. Nguyen succeeds Tom Daly, who took office in 2002 and was elected last November to the state Assembly. 


